Haifley and Grijalva will work with staff to draft an advocacy letter for the Commission to consider.

Currently, Salud Para La Gente providers are participating and Santa Cruz County Park Friends volunteers are working with providers at the new Live Oak Community Health Center to set up a similar arrangement.

Re: Accessible Public Transportation

Dear Chair Koenig and Members of the Board,

The purpose of this letter is to express the *Santa Cruz County Commission on Disabilities'* concerns regarding the provision of accessible, affordable public transportation as well as services historically provided by SCMTD staff related to accessibility services coordination and eligibility determination.

To the best of our knowledge, Metro's former *Accessible Services Coordinator* retired in 2020 and more recently, the former *Eligibility Coordinator* retired in 2022. As a result, the provision of accessible, affordable public transportation to Santa Cruz County residents with disabilities has suffered both in terms of quality and availability. Some concerns brought to the attention of the Commission are as follows:

- Too few spaces for wheelchairs on METRO buses, resulting in buses simply leaving riders with wheelchairs at the bus stop;
- ParaCruz rides frequently arriving more than 30 minutes after scheduled pick-up times, resulting in riders missing important appointments (e.g., medical, court dates, job interviews etc.);
- Riders requesting eligibility determination experiencing delays of more than a month to receive confirmation of ParaCruz eligibility;
- ParaCruz reportedly handling evacuation requests on a first-come, first-served basis rather than
 prioritizing evacuations for people with disabilities during the recent weather events; and
- Removal of a number of bus stops resulting in riders being denied eligibility for ParaCruz services because of their lack of proximity to remaining bus stops.

The accessibility of Metro services determines the accessibility of our entire community by providing access to jobs, health care, the legal system, shopping, entertainment, and social and political events for seniors and people with disabilities, particularly the most economically vulnerable members of these communities. Maintaining full-time staff to determine eligibility, coordinate access to services, and advise SCMTD staff who draft policy related to accessible public transit services is crucial to the overall accessibility of Metro services. Today we once again advocate for Metro to maintain full-time staff in this capacity and prioritize recruitment efforts with a view to filling the position as soon as is practicable.

We appreciate your consideration on behalf of the disabilities community in Santa Cruz County.

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Commission on Disabilities – Strategic Action Plan Match

2.72.060 Powers and duties.

The Commission shall exercise the following responsibilities in its efforts to serve persons with disabilities within this County:

- (A) Review existing County policies that affect persons with disabilities and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors regarding any proposed changes; (3B)
- (B) Review Sections 503 and 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and its implementing regulations and advise the Board of Supervisors on any actions necessary to bring the County into compliance with the Federal requirements and to eliminate discrimination against persons with disabilities; (1D)
- (C) Review the provision of access for persons with disabilities to public places within the County and recommend improvements where needed; (1C)
- (D) Review the County's equal employment opportunity plan and policies, and recommend to the Board of Supervisors and Equal Employment Opportunity Commission any revisions which may be necessary to eliminate employment discrimination against persons with disabilities; (3A) and (3B)
- (E) Review the County's personnel rules and job descriptions, and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, and to the Civil Service Commission, as necessary, to ensure that any unnecessary barriers to the employment of persons with disabilities are removed; (3B)
- (F) Advise the Board of Supervisors on any other appropriate programs and actions which would increase employment opportunities for persons with disabilities; (3A), (3B), and (1D)
- (G) Evaluate services provided to persons with disabilities in the County and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors based on their conclusions; (1A), (1B), and (1D)
- (H) Review requests by persons with disabilities or organizations for County assistance, and advise the Board of Supervisors on appropriate actions; (1B)
- (I) Investigate citizen complaints related to concerns of persons with disabilities and recommend appropriate actions to the Board of Supervisors; (1B)
- (J) Review Federal and State legislation of interest to persons with disabilities and advise the Board of Supervisors of their recommendation; and (1D)
- (K) Exercise other responsibilities related to the needs and concerns of persons with disabilities in the County. (1A), (2A), (2B), (2C), (2D), (4A) and (4B)
